Blood Drive **Friday, April 28th from 2 - 7 pm** **Activity Center**

The Knights of Columbus Council # 12988 of St Elizabeth Seton Parish is sponsoring a blood drive to assist the American Red Cross in maintaining a supply of blood. The Blood Drive will be held in the St. Elizabeth Seton Parish Activity Center on Friday, April 28th from 2:00 pm – 7:00 pm. It is recommended that donors schedule their appointments rather than walking-in by either visiting the Red Cross web site at www.redcrossblood.org, clicking on “Enter Sponsor Code”, entering the sponsor code **8088**, and following the site’s instructions; or by calling 1-800-448-3543.

Basic Eligibility Requirements

Most healthy adults can give blood through the American Red Cross. You meet the basic eligibility requirements if you:

- are at least 17 years old
- weigh at least 110 pounds
- are in good health on the day of donation
- have no history of exposure to hepatitis or AIDS
- your last blood donation was at least 56 days (8 weeks) ago

Fix-It Team

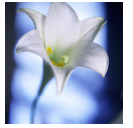
